AMSA is the national regulator responsible for commercial maritime safety, protection of the marine environment, and maritime and aviation search and rescue



Move towards service delivery

- **1 July 2017**
- **Transition program & IT Build with a single national database with a user interface**
- **Focus on online service delivery but still face to face availability with technical staff located around the country**





Cost Recovery

- AMSA regulates approximately **27,000 vessels** and **66,000 masters and crew** across the country.
- Large variation in fleet size, condition and operations
- Agreed by all jurisdictions in **2014** as part of move to AMSA service delivery
- 2 models developed by AMSA plus proposed fee for service
- To commence **1 July 2017**

AMSA's commitment

- Review to create a more flexible regulatory framework, aim to streamline without compromising safety
- Work in progress and want to collaborate with industry
- Compliance focus on high-risk, lower-compliance sectors
- AMSA restructure
